How often do you see British people? Do you get surprised by stereotypes? First impressions can be dangerous because you can be surprised in a particular way if you don't expect it. For example, you might see a woman wearing a headscarf in a particular group. This can be a good sign, or it could be a bad sign. Sometimes people are surprised by things that are not usually worn. What do you think about this?

The stereotype is to believe that if you wear these clothes, you are a certain kind of person and you are often surprised and are angry and shouting when you see a British person who is not wearing any of these clothes. Do you think these people would really wear these clothes, or are they just wearing them to help the police out, or are they just wearing them to be different and to show that they are not British? What do you think about this?
